## 58.1 PRESENTATION – ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AWARENESS

The representatives gave a presentation regarding Alzheimer's Disease Awareness. They spoke regarding the work achieved in the previous year and what they hope to achieve in the forthcoming year. A new booklet has been published placed in each of the hospitals in Northern Ireland to inform nursing staff regarding dementia diseases and the requirements of those patients suffering with dementia. Each member received a pack which included a shorter version of the NI Dementia Strategy Document which highlights the services that they provide.

Councillor Stevenson thanked the representatives for their presentation and enquired if they had approached any of the local businesses to seek support for their services and he reinforced their request for volunteers.

Mr Doherty explained that England, Scotland and Wales already have a current Dementia Strategy document in place however, Northern Ireland's was due to be published in January 2011 and has been put back to Spring 2011. Problems are implementation and funding. However, he hoped that members would assist in lobbying local MLA's in order to get the document published.

In answer to Councillor Simpson's question, Mr Doherty explained that currently there is no cure for dementia, it is unclear what is causing the disease, however current medication can help the condition from deteriorating for approximately three to five years.

In response to the Chair's request to give a presentation at the Millenium Centre in Loughgiel, Mr Friel agreed.

The Chair thanked the representatives for attending the meeting and the work that they are doing.

## Item 3 - D/2010/0273/O - Refusal

Letter of objection related to flooding.

The Planning Officer advised that a similar application on this site was refused and the decision upheld at appeal. The land was then zoned for development in the NEAP but is no de-zoned in the dNAP. Councillors Finlay and Stevenson queried by planners gave consideration to an anonymous objection. Planning Officer advised that such letters are filed but decisions are based on planning considerations.

## D/2010/0006/O – Approval

Councillor Finlay and Councillor Halliday expressed their disappointment regarding the retention of the old existing wall.

Councillor Stevenson stated that at a previous meeting the Planning Officer had not advised that an application had been approved despite the Council's Environmental Health Department having objected on environmental grounds i.e. service delivery. He requested that in future Planning Service let Council know of such objections as it might influence its decision making. The Planning Officer advised that there had been no intention to mislead Council, and that the Environmental Officer had informed him that the matter could be resolved. The Planning Service adhere to their own legislation in decision making.

Councillor Stevenson asked for an update on the planning applications submitted for Council's capital projects. The Planning Officer advised that:-

- Ballybogey scheme has been approved.
- Stranocum scheme updated drawings received and roads issues ongoing.
- Balnamore: Proposals to accommodate parking requirements under consideration by school management.

### 58.4 PROPOSED WAITING MEETINGHOUSE STREET

It has been brought to Roads Service attention that vehicles parking on a narrow section of road at Meetinghouse Street are obstructing the flow of traffic using the street. As a consequence Roads Service are proposing to introduce a section of double yellow lines to join the existing waiting restrictions on Meetinghouse Street off Rodeing foot, Ballymoney.

This item was deferred from Council Meeting 935 held on 4<sup>th</sup> January 2011.

It was proposed by Councillor Stevenson, seconded by Councillor Finlay and **AGREED:** 

that Council agrees to the introduction of proposed double yellow lines to the south side of Meetinghouse Street, but objects to the proposed markings on the north side.

## 58.6 PLANNING PROCEDURES

The Chief Executive of the DOE Planning & Local Government Group has written to advise Council of a change in operational planning procedures. In order to ensure planning applications are dealt with efficiently it is critical to radically reduce the large number of backlogged applications. The economic downturn has accentuated the difficulties in progressing these backlogged major applications primarily because applicants are either unable or unwilling to provide the key additional information needed to progress the application to a decision. The consequence is that Planning Service can only progress these backlogged applications to a decision through refusals based on the absence of key information. Applicants/developers will be given sufficient time to either provide the outstanding material or withdraw these backlogged applications should they prefer to avoid refusal notices.

If Council requires clarification on any issues Planning Service will meet to discuss.

Councillor Finlay stated that he would like clarification on all of these issues.

Councillor McCamphill suggested that it would be advantageous if the agents' telephone numbers were included in future Planning Schedules.

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Councillor Robinson and **AGREED:**

The Department for Regional Development (DRD) is carrying out a consultation on the 10 Year Review of the Regional Development Strategy. The consultation period runs from 6 January to 31 March 2011.

The purpose of the RDS is to provide an overarching spatial framework to influence the future distribution of activities throughout the Region to 2035. The consultation document addresses key challenges on climate change, rebuilding and rebalancing the economy, population growth, the location of jobs and houses, infrastructure provision and the protection of our natural and built environment.
