### 335.2 BALLYMONEY MUSEUM – APPLICATION TO HERITAGE LOTTERY

A verbal communication has been received from the Heritage Lottery Fund advising that the Council's Stage 11 application has been successful. The Director reported that a letter of offer confirming the 75% grant aid from Heritage Lottery Fund would be received within the next few days. She advised that the estimated project costs was £385,000 and the 75% grant amended to £288,500, leaving a Council cost of around £96,500.

## AMENITIES

### 335.9 STRANOCUM WAR MEMORIAL

The question of undertaking repairs/improvements to Stranocum War Memorial was last discussed by Committee on 17<sup>th</sup> October 2006. The relevant minute LAC323 was reproduced and circulated. Application was made, as Council had agreed, to the War Memorials Trust supported by two quotations as it had required, the lowest quote for the work being £6,865 plus fees. The War Memorials Trust has advised that it would be willing to offer a grant of up to £1,500 towards the work. This means a project shortfall of at least £6,050 which because of the manner provision was made in the Council's budget for 2007-2008 would have to be made available from the Council's reserves. Should Council wish to avail of the grant offered by the War Memorials Trust a signed contract needs to be returned to the Trust by 13<sup>th</sup> October 2007.

Further research on the ownership of the war memorial was undertaken for the funding application. Ken Switzer of the Ulster War Memorials Association has confirmed that Stranocum War Memorial was taken into public ownership (Ballymoney Rural District Council) in Spring 1920. Council therefore has a legal duty of care regarding the ongoing maintenance of the memorial.

Given the Council's statutory duty **IT IS RECOMMENDED** that Council undertake the required work and to assist with the cost of the project enter into the contract sought by the War Memorials Trust in order to obtain the grant of £1,500 the Trust has proffered.

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Councillor Cavlan and **AGREED:**

***to recommend to Council that it undertake the required work at Stranocum War Memorial and avail of the grant offered by the War Memorials Trust.***

**335.11 BUS SHELTERS**

**11.1 Requests for Additional Council Bus Shelters**

In the present financial year the budget set aside by Council would enable three further bus shelters to be provided. When this matter was last considered in 2006 priority was not given to a request for a shelter at Ballyknock. Since Committee last considered where bus shelters might be provided further requests have been received regarding provision at Balnamore, Bregagh Road, and Cupindale Corner. These suggested locations have been referred to Translink for comment.



This matter is brought to Committee in order that the above requests might be considered by Members.

The Director advised that since his report to Committee had been written, a further request had been received in respect of the provision by Council of a bus shelter at Moneyleck Road, Rasharkin. He then gave the information provided thus far by Ulsterbus, concerning the potential passenger numbers and made Members aware that as yet no specific sites had been identified for any of the locations. He stated that were Committee content, it would be appropriate to now try to identify specific sites at each potential location where Council might erect a bus shelter and that then Committee could give further consideration to the matter.

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Councillor Robinson and **AGREED**:

***to recommend to Council that further work be done in order to identify appropriate sites at Ballyknock, Balnamore, Bregagh Road, Cupindale Corner and Moneyleck Road, Rasharkin.***

#### **11.2 Ballybogey Bus Stops and Shelter**

Members are asked to note that in conjunction with DRD Roads Service, Ulsterbus has relocated its bus stops to the main road. The extant shelter is therefore obsolete and Council has been asked to remove it.

A request has been made to Clear Channel that two new shelters be erected at the new stops situated on Ballybogey Road, as at peak times there are approximately 20 school children at each stop.

**335.13 MATTERS ARISING MEETING NO 334 HELD 21<sup>ST</sup> AUGUST 2007****13.1 Priest's Well Rasharkin: Assertion As A Public Right Of Way (Ref: 334.7)**

It was proposed by Councillor McKay that Council assert the Priest's Well path as a Public Right of Way.

Alderman Simpson advised that he had not as yet had the opportunity to visit the site, since receiving the location map provided by the Director on 3<sup>rd</sup> September.

The Director again advised Members that it was the case that the landowners, after taking legal advice, had advised on 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2007 that they agreed that the access to the 'Priest's Well', Rasharkin, constituted a public right of way (PROW) and that they were content that Council undertake its statutory duty and assert the laneway as a PROW. The Access to the Countryside (NI) Order 1983 Part II, section 3 (1) states "a district council shall assert, protect and keep open and free from obstruction or encroachment any public right of way".

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Alderman Simpson and **AGREED:**

***to recommend to Council to defer any decision until the next Council meeting.***

**13.2 Lower Bann Partnership Company and Lough Neagh & Lower Bann Advisory Committees (Financial Contribution, Ref: 334.1.1)**

The Mayor intimated that he wished to stand down from the Lower Bann Partnership due to the pressure of his other commitments.

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Councillor Stevenson and **AGREED:**

***to recommend to Council that Councillor Robinson represent it on the Lower Bann Partnership Company.***

The Chair advised that it was necessary to augment the motion agreed at the Council meeting held on 3<sup>rd</sup> September in order to ensure clarity for audit purposes. The Director advised that the contribution each organization sought in the current financial year was £5,000 and that as no provision had been made in this year's budget the money would have to come from the Council's reserves.

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Councillor Stevenson and **AGREED:**

***that the Council make a financial contribution of £5,000 each to both the Lower Bann Partnership Company and the Lough Neagh & Lower Bann Advisory Committees for 2007-2008 and that the contributions be made from the Council's revenue reserves.***

### **13.3 Proposed Play Area at Derrykeighan (Ref: 334.8)**

The Director gave further advice concerning the proposal. He intimated that it was necessary to establish a need and that this might be done by way of a survey and then to consider whether the need identified was more pressing than other similar needs. He advised that it was necessary to consider carefully the precedent which would be set were Council minded to provide a facility on land it did not own or control and set out a number of difficulties which were inherent in such a proposition. He stated that the project would be more straightforward were the land on which the proposed play area was to be provided to be under Council control and that this could be attained by means of a lease.

Councillor Robinson advised Committee that the Chair, Alderman Connolly and herself intend to make contact with the Community Association at Derrykeighan in due course to extract further information.

### **13.4 Killyrammer Community Centre (Ref: 334.9)**

The Director indicated that since the last meeting he had researched the matter further to discover that at the Leisure & Amenities Committee meeting held on 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2006 Committee had agreed "to further recommend that the Council's Consultants, R. Robinson & Sons draw up a Scheme of works at an estimated cost of £40,000" and that this recommendation had been adopted by Council at its meeting on 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2006. He outlined the nature of the work proposed be carried out to the Council's property which had been identified at a meeting held in the summer which was estimated to cost that amount and stated that this would form the basis of the brief to the Council's consultants. He reminded Members that at the Council meeting on 3<sup>rd</sup> September the amount of the Council's contribution to the upgrade of its property had been clarified and so all the necessary elements were now in place to progress the matter in accordance with the Council's normal procedures. In response to a question from the Mayor, the Director indicated that in order to expedite the improvements sought Council

could use the 'open' rather than the 'select list' tender procedure.

It was proposed by Councillor Robinson, seconded by Councillor Stevenson and **AGREED:**

***to recommend to Council that it carry out the identified work to its property at Killyrammer Community Centre, making use of the 'open' tender procedure.***

The Director of Borough Services gave a resume of this business to date making reference to Minute LAC332.15 (19<sup>th</sup> June 2007), applications from Glebeside Community Association in respect of the provision on Council land at Alexandra Avenue, Ballymoney of a multi-use games arena, the 2005 Megaw Park Upgrade Scheme and the 2007 Megaw Park Upgrade Scheme. He advised that the Council bid for Peace 3 Shared Spaces Funding for the current proposed Megaw Park Upgrade Scheme made in May 2007 had unfortunately been unsuccessful.
