#### LEISURE SERVICES

#### 396.1 MINUTES OF MEETING NO 395 - 15<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2012

It was proposed by Alderman Connolly seconded by Councillor Halliday and AGREED:

to recommend that the minutes of Meeting No  $395 - 15^{th}$  May 2012, as circulated, be approved.

#### 396.2 PRESENTATION BY BALLYMONEY SPORTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Chair welcomed representatives of Ballymoney Sports Advisory Committee, Mr Thomas Skelton and Mr John Fall to the committee and invited them to make their presentation on the work of their committee during the last year, attached as Appendix A.

Members commended the Sports Advisory Committee on the excellent work they have done for the community paying particular tribute to Council employee John Fall. Councillor Finlay encouraged the public to support and attend the Annual Sports Awards.

#### 396.3JOEY DUNLOP LEISURE CENTRE - PRICING POLICY

The Director circulated a proposed pricing policy effective from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2012. Committee is requested to consider the proposed charges and make a recommendation to Council.

The Director reminded members that prices were frozen last year, this was the first year that there was no increase in prices, she drew comparisons with pricing structures for activities and facilities at neighbouring councils.

Members, aware of the very difficult economic climate, suggested looking at the issue of the pricing policy at the next budget round. The Director shall bring an interim report on Income in the Autumn for members' information.

It was proposed by Alderman Cousley, seconded by Councillor Robinson and AGREED:

to recommend that Council freeze the prices at the Joey Dunlop Leisure Centre at the current 2011/12 rate for all facilities and activities and review again at the next budget round.

## 396.4RESEARCH PROJECT ON COMMISSIONING OF VOLUNTARY GENERALIST ADVICE SERVICES

The research project on the Commissioning of Voluntary Generalist Advice Services, carried out by Williamson Consulting is now complete, and a presentation of the consultants' report, for all four Councils was held in Coleraine on 10<sup>th</sup> May 2012.

A summary of the report was circulated and a copy of the full report is available upon request.

A number of fully researched options for the way forward in relation to the commissioning of voluntary generalist advice services at local government level have been documented with a preferred option detailed.

**IT IS RECOMMENDED** that Council approve the preferred option – a single public tender, as detailed in the report 'Commissioning of Voluntary Generalist Advice – Review for North East Councils'.

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Councillor Atkinson and AGREED:

to recommend that Council approve the preferred option – a single public tender, as detailed in the report 'Commissioning of Voluntary Generalist Advice – Review for North East Councils':

#### **396.5GOOD RELATIONS GRANTS**

The following applications were considered:

- (i) St James Presbyterian Church Youth Club for assistance towards a "Showstoppers" event;
- (ii) Rasharkin Community Association for assistance towards a Learning Together project.

Both applications meet the criteria of the Goods Relations Small Grants Scheme.

**IT IS RECOMMENDED** that the 2 groups are awarded £300.00 each.

It was proposed by Councillor Atkinson, seconded by Councillor Robinson and AGREED:

to recommend that Council grant £300 each to (i) St James Presbyterian Church Youth Club for assistance towards a "Showstoppers" event and (ii) Rasharkin Community Association for assistance towards a Learning Together project.

#### 396.6 COMMUNITY SUPPORT GRANTS

The Director advised that 4 applications have been received but unfortunately no finance assistance can be provided as the Community Support Grant Scheme budget is completely expended.

Grants were awarded to 26 groups totalling £5195.00.

Members regret that no further assistance is available under this scheme, but were pleased that 26 groups were assisted on a 'first come, first served' basis.

#### 396.7BALLYMONEY MUSEUM - EXHIBITION PROGRAMME

The Exhibition programme from January 2013 to August 2014 was circulated at the meeting. The Director drew members' attention to the range of PEACE III funded Exhibition Programmes of which Council has an interest.

The Director further advised that a verbal offer of a placement worker has been received from the Northern Ireland Museum Council from October 2012 to September 2013, under the Collection Skills Initiative, Museum Bursary Placement Scheme. The placements, funded by the National Lottery Fund, are being provided to host museums so that trainees can develop collections focused skills and complete a specific project, in our case the GAA project.

The Director will report further when a formal offer has been received.

#### 396.8 MAYOR'S SHOW

The Director advised that the Annual Mayor's Show is on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> June.

This year a theme has been introduced for the floats – "So much to remember, so much to celebrate".

Members are requested to indicate their availability to act as judges of the various vintage categories at the show. A letter in this regard has been sent to all members.

Councillor Finlay commented that HM The Queen has been representing the whole community for 60 years and it is right to pay tribute to her by associating the Annual Mayors Show with the Queen's Diamond Jubilee.

#### 396.9 3G PITCH AT DALRIADA

The Director advised of correspondence received from Tony Morrison, a member of the Board of Governors of Dalriada School seeking assistance from Council with the delivery of their mini sports development plan outside school hours.

The Director reminded members of the limited resources in the Sports Development Unit, which last year committed to delivering the 3 year, 100% funded Active Communities Programme. One of the objectives of the Active Communities Programme is that coaching is delivered in the communities making use of schools, community centres and outdoor facilities.

The Director advised that there may be occasions when Council facilities are not available due to other bookings or weather conditions, and that the 3G pitch at Dalriada could be used to deliver programmes.

During discussion members agreed that the Council was committed to deliver an extensive programme throughout the borough with limited resources.

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Alderman Connolly and AGREED:

to recommend that Council respond to Tony Morrison stating that due to limited resources Council is unable to assist with programme delivery at this time.

#### 396.10 AMENITIES CHARGES 2012-2013

The charges for Riada Stadium and Football Pitches, Cemeteries, Town Hall, Social Centre and Drumaheglis Marina & Caravan Park have been reviewed and the revised charges for 2012-2013 and are attached as Appendix B.

**IT IS RECOMMENDED** that Council implement the new charges from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2012, with the exception that the new charges for Drumaheglis Caravan Park (together with Marina slipping and boatpark) be implemented from 1<sup>st</sup> March 2013.

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Alderman Connolly and AGREED:

to recommend that Council implement the new Amenities charges from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2012, with the exception that the new charges for Drumaheglis Caravan Park (together with Marina slipping and boatpark) be implemented from 1<sup>st</sup> March 2013.

#### 396.12 BALLYMONEY CEMETERY MEMORIALS

Applications have been received as undernoted for the erection of memorials in Ballymoney Cemetery.

**IT IS RECOMMENDED** that Council grant permission for the above memorials to be erected in Ballymoney Cemetery, subject to usual requirements.

It was proposed by Councillor Halliday, seconded by Councillor Robinson and AGREED:

to recommend that Council grant permission for the above memorials to be erected in Ballymoney Cemetery, subject to usual requirements.

#### 396.13 AMENITIES CAPITAL PROJECTS UPDATE

The Director delivered the following updates for members' information and responded to queries.

#### 1) Cloughmills Bio Park

It is the case that planning approval has now been obtained for the entire project. Due to external funding needs 2 no. applications had to be submitted and although both were streamlined it took much longer to achieve permission than that process would suggest. As the deadline for completion in order to realise the Big Lottery funding is December 2012 it will be necessary to prioritise this element of the overall project, working in partnership with C.A.T. Work is also progressing to put together the funding necessary to complete phase one in its entirety and also the whole of the riverside `boardwalk' path,

#### 2) Connect2 Bridge

Work is advancing well as regard this £1.3m investment in the town's infrastructure. Many will have noted that Ballymoney's own iconic arch is now in place as the bridge connecting the town core and its southern environs via Riverside Park and the railway station takes shape. It is likely that the project's construction phase will be complete by end of September 2012.

#### 3) Dervock Community Facilities

As has previously been reported, planning approval has been secured in respect of this project, which is estimated at circa £1.3m. Whilst Council is providing £1m, the project commencement is contingent on securing a grant of £247,500 which has been sought from the Rural Development Programme. Although this endeavour has not been without angst it is understood that the Council's project may be approved.

#### 4) Drumaheglis Marina & Caravan Park

In order to secure planning approval for the next phase of the development of this facility, which is the Council's prime tourist amenity, it has been necessary to commission archaeological work. It is important that matters are progressed as necessary permissions must be extant in order to continue to complete for external funding packages.

#### 5) Glebeside Facilities

Planning approval has been secured for the Council's overall Glebeside project developed in conjunction with the Community Association. Work is ongoing with the Housing Executive in order to secure the additional land required to provide the "small sided" pitch element. Completion of this phase of the project is necessary in order to determine the funding required for the entire project.

#### 6) Megaw Park

Planning approval has been obtained for this Council project.

#### 7) Rasharkin "Shared Space" Project

Following the Council's decision to partner with the Community Association and Groundwork NI to utilize some £176,500 of external funding to provide additional facilities at Drumbolcan Park, members are asked to note that planning approval is presently being sought.

#### 8) Rasharkin Community Playgroup Request

As has been previously advised work has been undertaken, in conjunction with the Community Playgroup, to develop a scheme to improve that Group's present accommodation at the Community Centre. The estimated cost of the proposal is circa £65,000.

At the meeting the Director advised that having had the opportunity to speak to the Chair of the Community Playgroup, that the Group are presently pursuing a different option to be in place by September 2013 and are not now interested in extending the Group's present accommodation at the Community Centre.

#### 9) Riverside Park, Ballymoney

A preliminary survey was undertaken in conjunction with RCC (a body which would do a lot of work with the Rivers Agency in Northern Ireland) in March 2012. A report setting out a number of possible options together with budget costings is awaited.

#### 10) Ballybogey MUGA

Planning approval is presently being sought for this facility for which RDP funding has been secured.

The Director asked Committee to note that circa £2.5M in external funding was either already committed or being sought in order to realise the majority [7 out of the 10] amenities projects referred to above.

#### 396.14 DRD ACTIVE TRAVEL PROPOSAL - COLERAINE AND BALLYMONEY

Members are informed that a joint bid proposal was submitted by the deadline of Friday 18 May comprising an estimated capital funding of £1,140,784.00 including joint monitoring, cycle parking, signage and interpretation. The joint bid seeks to build upon the extensive existing walking and cycling infrastructure in both towns. In Coleraine the focus is on a new 2.4KM shared use link from Castleroe village to Christie Park, including a new access ramp into the park at £373,623. In Ballymoney some 6 priority routes were identified and in consultation with Roads Service 3 were submitted within the scope of this bid (3.2 Km) at a cost of £735,913;

**Route 1**: Armour Avenue to JDLC via Ballymena Road, Riada Avenue and Garryduff Road (1.7 Km). Cost £375,269.

**Route 2**: Armour Avenue to Bravallen Road via Rodeing Foot, Meetinghouse Street, Castle Street and Gate End (360m). Cost £67,495.

**Route 3**: A26 Frosses Road from Greenhill Road to Seacon Road via Portrush Road Roundabout (1.1Km) Cost £293,149.

The timescales set for the bid were very short, only a matter of weeks, and the amount of information and costings gathered during this period was substantial. It should be noted that without significant extra input from both the Coleraine and Ballymoney Countryside Access Officers in conjunction with the relevant Roads Service Sections, it would not have been possible to make such a submission in the timescales presented.

It is hoped to hear shortly from DRD regarding the success or otherwise of the submission. On a positive note, Roads Service have intimated that, even if the bid is unsuccessful, it would hope to provide a significant portion of Route 2 in Ballymoney given the amount of work that has been undertaken on this project.

The Director emphasised the considerable work put into the bid not only by Council staff [in particular its Countryside Access Officer] but also by Roads Service personnel and the fact that the external funding being sought for the Borough was £735,913 out of the £1.1M joint bid with Coleraine.

#### 396.15 BIKE WEEK 2012 IN BALLYMONEY

As Members are aware Ballymoney is celebrating Bike Week 2012 (16<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> June). The Council's Countryside Access Officer, in conjunction with others, has again put together an imaginative programme of events over the course of the week (circulated).

#### 396.16 BUS SHELTER REQUEST UPDATE

The Director advised that preliminary work has been undertaken, in conjunction with all the other relevant agencies as regards the undernoted proposed bus shelter locations—

#### 1) Ballybogey

Need has been confirmed. Further work being progressed to secure the only suitable location on the western side of Ballybogey Road.

#### 2) <u>Drones/Fivey Road junction</u>

Whilst need confirmed, it was determined that, in terms of road safety, it isn't advisable to provide a bus shelter at this location.

#### 3) Drones/Knockahollet Road junction

Need has been confirmed. Further work is being progressed in order to be satisfied that a new shelter could be erected to the north of the junction.

#### 4) Kilraughts Road

Further preliminary work is being progressed to respect of a potential location in the vicinity of nos. 2&4.

#### 5) Magherahoney

A possible site for the relocation of a bus shelter to service the community has been identified and will be further investigated with those having control of the necessary land.

In response to Alderman Connolly the Director advised that the present bus shelter would not be removed prior to the installation of a new shelter.

#### 6) Shanaghy Road

A possible site was identified but without necessary consent the provision of a bus shelter at the location remains in abeyance.

#### 396.17 COUNTY ANTRIM MILK CUP COMMITTEE

The Director referred to the correspondence received from the County Antrim Milk Cup Committee which had been tabled at the April Committee meeting requesting financial support for the County Antrim Team in the 2012 Northern Ireland Milk Cup. He advised that given budgetary constraints that Committee consider offering 'training facilities'.

It was proposed by Councillor Atkinson, seconded by Councillor Robinson and AGREED:

to recommend that Council support the County Antrim Milk Cup Team in the 2012 Northern Ireland Milk Cup by offering complimentary use of training facilities within the Borough.

#### 396.18 REQUEST FOR USE OF RIVERSIDE PARK

The Director has received correspondence from Faith Mission to hold an Open Air Service in Riverside Park on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> July at 3pm.

It was proposed by Councillor Stevenson, seconded by Alderman Connolly and AGREED:

to recommend that Council grant the Faith Mission the use of Riverside Park on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> July at 3pm to hold an Open Air Service.

#### 396.19 PURCHASE OF REPLACEMENT VEHICLE

The Director advised that subsequent to the commitment of the Directorate vehicle replacement budget for 2012-2013, a 14 year old van used to deliver essential amenities services had failed and was not repairable. In order to maintain services he requested Committee to consider authorising the purchase of a necessary replacement in 2012 and advised that money raised by the disposal of scrap and other surplus items via auction could be used to offset the cost. The Director responded to member questions.

It was proposed by Councillor Stevenson, seconded by Alderman Connolly and AGREED:

to recommend that Council purchase in 2012, the additional replacement vehicle sought, namely a fitted out high roof van, at a cost of £25,000.

Councillor Robinson abstained.

This being all the business the meeting closed at 9.37pm.

#### Conditions of hire for Recreation Grounds

- 1. A receipted booking slip system is operated. All bookings to be made and confirmed with payment in advance, at Borough Services Directorate, Riada House, 14 Charles Street, Ballymoney, tel 028 2766 0227 not later that two days prior to the date of fixture i.e. Saturday matches must be confirmed by 5.00pm on the prior Wednesday.
- 2. Clubs, members of affiliated or recognised leagues shall on application be considered for allocation of a ground for the season. Where such application is approved, Clubs shall have first option on booking provided that the specified booking period shall apply.
- 3. The period of hire is 2 ½ hours and shall commence ½ hour prior to scheduled kick off time (e.g. kick off 11.00am, period of hire 10.30am 1.00pm). Clubs exceeding period of hire specified on receipted booking slip shall be liable to a surcharge calculated in periods of not less than ½ hours and charged at a rate of £8.00 seniors/£4.00 juniors per period.
- 4. All booking slips shall be produced to the Caretaker on request and only on receipt of same shall facilities be authorized for use
- 5. Goal nets are available on request and Clubs wishing to use them shall be responsible for erection, removal and return of same to the caretaker. <a href="PVC tape must not be used to fix nets to goals.">PVC tape must not be used to fix nets to goals.</a> Fasclips have been fitted to nets for this purpose.
- Facilities are let for the use specified and the hirer shall indemnify the Ballymoney Borough Council against the following:
  - (i) all damage to changing facilities including injury to the walls, glass, fixtures or fittings therein.
  - (ii) all damage to or loss of equipment.

- 7. During periods of poor weather conditions (ie Saturday matches) <u>clubs should contact</u> the department 028 2766 0227 on Fridays between 11.00am and 1.00pm to confirm <u>if their pitch is playable</u>. In all cases where pitches are declared unplayable by an Officer of Ballymoney Borough Council, a transfer of booking shall apply.
- 8. Ballymoney Borough Council shall not be responsible for failure of Clubs to fulfil bookings and in all such cases where the Caretaker is on duly and a booking is not fulfilled no transfer of booking shall apply.
