#### **ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES**

#### 1. Vehicle Tenders

As Members are aware fixed price tenders were sought for the supply and delivery of 1 no. 26t GVW Side-Loading Refuse Collection Vehicle by 12.00 noon, Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> June 2006. The 4 no. tenders received were opened by the Committee Chair and Director of Borough Services on 6<sup>th</sup> June 2006 and a schedule detailing the tenderers and products offered, together with an evaluation report is to be found as Appendix 1, page 14, to this report.

In the ensuing discussion the Director responded to Members questions. He advised that Environment & Heritage Service had stated in the new NI Waste Management Strategy – 'Towards Resource Management' that it would undertake

a Waste Characterisation Study in 2006. He indicated that this may be very helpful to NI district councils, as more recent work in carried out on the mainland had given figures for biodegradable municipal waste of 68% and 63% whereas the NI 2000 survey figure for the province was 71%.

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Alderman Campbell and **AGREED**:

to recommend that Council write to the Department of Environment and insist that a Waste Characterisation Study be carried out without further delay.

The Chair informed the Committee that new plastic bags to be introduced by Tesco would not be bio-degradable as previously thought but would instead be degradable which means that they will just break up into small pieces. It was felt that this would not be good for the environment.

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Councillor Wilson and **AGREED**:

to recommend that Council write a letter to Tescos seeking the introduction of bio-degradable bags and not those which are cheaper and will cause environmental damage; and

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION**

#### 3. Updating and Screening Assessment 2006

Ballymoney Borough Council is under a statutory obligation to review and assess air quality from time to time. This is known as local air quality management (LAQM).

The Council has already completed the first round of review and assessment of local air quality in April 2001 and has now undertaken the second round. A phased approach is used to review and assess air quality. The first stage of the review and assessment process is an updating and screening assessment. This identifies any changes that have occurred since the first round that may have an effect on air quality and which require a more detailed assessment.

An updating and screening assessment has been completed for Ballymoney Borough and has been circulated electronically to members. The conclusion of this report was that no further detailed assessments are required for any pollutants.

*IT IS RECOMMENDED* that Council note the conclusion of the updating and screening assessment that no further detailed assessments are required for any pollutants.

#### 4. <u>Industrial Pollution Control (NI) Order 1997</u> Register Of Public Information

The Industrial Pollution and Radiochemical Inspectorate has provided stock emission test results dated 4<sup>th</sup> May 2006 in respect of plant operated at Ballyboyland Quarry, Ballymoney for inclusion in the public register. The results were within the emissions limits.

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### 5. <u>Noise Complaint: Existing Commercial Business Without Planning</u> Permission.

The department has received a complaint from an occupier of residential premises affected by noise from a commercial property adjacent. A number of visits have been made to the premises with a view to resolving the issue. The owner of the commercial premises had agreed in writing, dated 18<sup>th</sup> January 2006 to enclose the noise source thus reducing the impact on the neighbouring property. To date no works have been completed. The noise originates from a dust extraction unit located at the front of the commercial premises and approximately 45m from the façade of the complainants dwelling. BS 4142.1997, "Rating of Industrial Noise affecting Mixed Residential and Industrial Areas" rates the likelihood of complaints in terms of how far the intruding noise is above the background noise level. A difference of 10dB or higher indicates that complaints are likely.

Noise level measurements taken by this department were found as follows:-

#### **Daytime**

(1) Level adjacent to the front entrance of complainants dwelling
 (2) Background level (noise source inaudible)
 64dB(A)
 40dB(A)

Determination of rating level in accordance with BS4142: 1997.

Assessment Level 69 - 40 = +29

Conclusion: Complaints very likely.

Council is asked to determine whether a statutory noise nuisance exists.

Where Council is satisfied that a statutory noise nuisance exists, or is likely to occur or recur, then Council shall serve a notice under Article 38(1) of the Pollution Control and Local Government (NI) Order 1978, requiring the abatement of the nuisance or prohibiting or restricting its occurrence or recurrence. The notice shall specify the time or times within which the requirements of the notice are to be complied with.

IT IS RECOMMENDED that a notice be served on the owner of the commercial premises under Article 38(1) of the Pollution Control and Local Government (NI)

Order 1978 requiring the abatement of the noise nuisance, and that a time period of 56 days (8 weeks) for compliance be given.

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#### FOOD CONTROL

#### **NEW LEGISLATION**

#### 6. The Contaminants in Food Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006

These Regulations which came into operation on 1<sup>st</sup> June make provision for the execution and enforcement of Commission Regulation (EC) No. 466/2001 setting maximum levels for contaminants in foodstuffs.

### 7. <u>The Ceramic Articles in Contact with Food Regulations (Northern Ireland)</u> 2006

The above Regulations which came into operation on 20<sup>th</sup> May 2006 and 2007, apply to ceramic articles which are intended to come into contact with food and set limits on the amount of lead and cadmium which may migrate from such articles.

#### 8. Eat Safe Award Scheme – Changes to Scheme, Scope and Criteria.

The FSA have recently reviewed the above scheme's criteria to take account of the new food hygiene regulations and to allow more businesses to have access.

All catering operations in Northern Ireland, irrespective of whether members of the public have access to them or not, are now included within the scope of the scheme and are eligible to receive an award if they meet the criteria. Previously the award was limited to catering operations open to the public.

On the introduction of the Food Hygiene Regulations (NI) 2006, all catering businesses are required to meet higher food hygiene standards, specifically in respect of training in the application of HACCP principles. The Eat Safe assessment criteria have been amended to accommodate this additional training requirement and requires that all staff responsible for the development and maintenance of food safety management systems have received appropriate training in the application of HACCP principles. A further minor change has also been made to the criteria to reflect changes to the food hygiene training qualifications offered by the CIEH.

There are currently four premises within the Borough that have achieved the award and almost 200 province-wide.

#### 9. Safer Food Better Business for Retailers (SFBB)

The FSANI have advised of the launch at the end of May 2006 of the Safer Food, Better Business pack for retailers. The pack developed by the FSA working with trade representatives, has been designed for small convenience stores, newsagents and health food shops who sell pre-packed food where the cold chain must be maintained. It includes a "cooking and preparation" section that covers specific activities that are commonly undertaken in small retail shops such as "baking off" bought in products and preparing ready to eat foods. A quantity of the packages are available through the Borough Services Directorate. Businesses may order packs free from the FSA publications helpline, 0845 606 0667, by email foodstandards@ecgroup.uk.com or downloading from the agency's website www.food.gov.uk/retail. The FSA are currently developing a training booklet for local authority enforcement officers on SFBB food safety management.

#### 13. Review of Borough Food Safety Plan 2005-2006

A review of service delivery in respect of the food function has been completed in accordance with the above plan.

93% of planned food hygiene inspections were achieved. The overall number of 'A' risk premises has fallen from 10% to 3% during the year, primarily as a result of increased standards and confidence in management. 72 food standards inspections were completed. 20 were new premises, 43 were planned for in the year 2005/2006 and 9 were brought forward from the year 2006/2007.

The FSA had issued a change of advice as to how food standards premises were risk scored. As a result a number of premises have changed categories and inspection dates rescheduled. These will be included within this years planned inspection programme.

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The department delivered a total of three foundation certificate courses in food hygiene (Level 1), two update courses and one intermediate course with 66 candidates being successful overall. It is intended that the revised CIEH courses, Level 2 award in food safety in catering be offered as part of an extended training programme by the department within the current year.

Two additional premises within the Borough achieved the provincial 'Eat Safe Award' promoted by the Food Standards Agency.

A total of 2061 officer hours were devoted to the delivery of the food service. Following the previous years review, a number of improvements were introduced to enhance internal monitoring and improve service delivery. The service was subject to an internal audit by officers from Northern Group Systems and additional recommendations are to be incorporated during the current plan to ensure continuous improvement. Further use has been made of the Councils website to promote food safety matters to the general public. It is intended to focus on this area during 2006-2007.

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#### 15. Review of Borough Health and Safety Plan 2005-06

Following completion of the annual return to the HSENI a review of the plan for the financial year 05-06 has been completed.

72% of all planned inspections were completed. This equated to 67% high risk and 75% of low risk premises. As an alternative enforcement strategy, two seminars were held targeting low risk premises. 22 businesses were represented with a number of businesses sending more than one employee. Those premises that did not accept the invitation to attend were issued with self-inspection questionnaires.

60 informal notices were issued detailing a range of health and safety contraventions. All reported accidents and complaints made to the department were investigated and a number of provincial initiatives following the HELANI Strategic Plan were supported. These included musculoskeletal disorders, stress management, falls from heights, care in the sun and noise control.

In partnership with Coleraine Borough Council, Moyle District Council, Northern Group Systems and the Northern Tobacco Control Group, a seminar was held to promote smoke free workplaces in advance of proposed smoke free legislation. Advice was given on the introduction of smoking policies award schemes and cessation support.

The CIEH foundation certificate in health and safety was again offered by the department with 7 candidates being successful. It is proposed to increase service delivery in line with demand during 2006-2007. A total of 883 hours were devoted to health and safety enforcement during the plan period. A number of improvements were put in place to improve service delivery during the year and this will continue during 2006-2007.

#### **BUILDING CONTROL**

25. <u>Building Control Applications</u>

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Council note the Applications, Building Notices and Regularisation Certificates as detailed in Appendix 3 (page 16) to this report, which are in accordance with the requirements of the Building Regulations (NI) 2000.

#### 26. Building Regulations Administration

Following Council decisions on re-structuring, a review of the arrangements which are necessary for the efficient and effective delivery of the building control function has been undertaken.

It is proposed, as is presently the case, that the determination of applications made to Council and associated matters under the Building Regulations (NI) 2000 and other relevant legislation be undertaken by officers with delegated authority. Council is empowered under the Building Regulations (NI) Order 1979 (as amended) to pass or reject plans submitted under Building Regulations. The decision to pass or reject is a purely technical matter, as plans which show compliance with the Regulations must be approved and those which do not must be rejected.

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Ballymoney Borough Council in exercise of its powers under Section 47(A) of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1972 delegates to

#### JOHN CAMPBELL MICHAEL, Director of Borough Services

its authority under the Building Regulations (NI) Order 1979 (as amended) to

- (1) pass or reject plans submitted;
- (2) approve building notices;
- (3) issue notices of contravention; and
- (4) issue regularisation and completion certificates;

and furthermore hereby also indemnifies the aforesaid officer as provided for by Section 48 of the 1972 Act.

IT IS FURTHER RECOMMENDED that in accordance with the provisions of Section 47(A) and 124 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1972 that where Council is empowered to issue documents associated with the administration of the Building Regulations, that JOHN CAMPBELL MICHAEL, Director of Borough Services, be duly authorised to authenticate notices, orders or other documents and that he has the authority to duly authorise other officers under his direction to authenticate notices, orders or other documents and Council hereby also indemnifies these officers as provided for by Section 48 of the 1972 Act.

As it presently the case decisions made as regard Building Regulations administration will be reported to Council in retrospect by the Director of Borough Services.

Should it be necessary to institute legal proceedings this will be initiated by report to Council in order to seek its specific authority.

It was proposed by Alderman Campbell, seconded by Councillor McCamphill and **AGREED**:

to recommend to Council that the Director of Borough Services, Mr John Michael be authorized as above.

#### 27. Authorisation of Group Building Control Officers

Under the provisions of the Local Government (Employment Group Building Control Staff) Order (Northern Ireland) 1994 Council may authorise Group Building Control Officers to under take, as may be required, any building control function that may be carried out by an officer employed directly by Council.

When so engaged such officers will work under the direction of this Council's Director of Borough Services and the Head of Building Control.

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Councils authorise Building Control Officers employed by Derry City Council under the Local Government (Employment of Group Building Control Staff) Order (Northern Ireland) 1994, to undertake any building control function exercisable by an officer of Ballymoney Borough Council within the Borough of Ballymoney.

It was proposed by Alderman Campbell, seconded by Councillor McCamphill and **AGREED**:

to recommend that Council authorise Building Control Officers employed by Derry City Council under the Local Government (Employment of Group Building Control Staff) Order (Northern Ireland) 1994, to undertake any building control function exercisable by an officer of Ballymoney Borough Council within the Borough of Ballymoney.

#### 28. Building Control Service Delivery

A review of how best to deliver the Councils building control function has been undertaken. As Members are aware the technical staff compliment was reduced by one officer when Council granted early retirement to its former Chief Building Control Officer. It is also the case that workload has not reduced.

As a consequence a number of changes are being introduced and trialed over the next three months. Members need to be aware that operational changes are being made and that this process may not be universally popular with service customers.

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#### 318.6 WASTE MANAGEMENT GRANT SPEND

The Directorclarified for Members that grant could be spent on 'bin' distribution and for new vehicle purchases if the vehicle was used to collect recyclates then that percentage use could be claimed. There was agreement that the 2005-2006 carry over money remain ear marked for 'brown' bins; that the newly acquired RCV used 50% for the collection of 'blue' bins be put forward as part of the claim for 2006-07 and that the 2007-2008 grant [£33,595] be used to further recycling activity. Discussion then ensued as to whether the remainder of the 2006-07 grant [£117,565 - £70,411] namely £47,154 ought to be applied to further recycling measures or to the purchase of a replacement vehicle [a Big Bite] sought but not

allowed in this years budgetary round. The Director advised that the replacement vehicle option was the more realistic to deliver in the timescale available.

It was proposed by Councillor McCamphill, seconded by Councillor Finlay and **AGREED:** 

to defer the decision until the July 3<sup>rd</sup> Council meeting so that members could discuss the issue their party colleagues; and

that the Director would furnish relevant financial information to party leaders.

#### 318.7 NORTHERN GROUP SYSTEMS (ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH) COMMITTEE

Councillor Finlay informed the Committee that due to his other commitments as Mayor and with work he did not feel that he had the time to commit to the Northern Group Systems (Environmental Health) Committee and although re-appointed at the Councils AGM he felt that the present Committee Chair ought to be a Council representative.

to recommend to Council that the Committee Chair, Councillor Robinson, take over this position.
