981.1 MAYOR'S ANNUAL ADDRESS

The Mayor addressed the meeting as follows:

"I welcome everyone to the Council's 37th Annual Meeting and wish to take a few minutes to reflect on my year in office and highlight some of the key achievements and activities during the year.

Supporting Local Groups and organizations

Over the past 12 months I have been pleased as Mayor to receive visitors from all walks of life and to accept invitations from a wide range of organizations. I held over 20 receptions and hosted many visits to the Mayor's Parlour to recognize the achievements of local individuals, charities and other groups.

Charity Fundraising

I was delighted to be supported in my fundraising activities for Macmillan Cancer and the NI Hospice and record my thanks to all who donated so generously at these events.

Condolences

Council extended condolences during the year to the family of Mrs Faye Holland, first Mayoress of Council, wife of Mr Fred Holland, first Mayor of the Borough.

Regiment Honoured

In September Council conferred the Freedom of the Borough on The 152 (Ulster) Transport Regiment of the Royal Logistics Corps of the Territorial Army, the highest honour it can bestow. I was honoured to preside over this occasion and to witness the support for the soldiers on parade from the people of Ballymoney.

Awards and Achievements

- The achievement of Michael Dunlop at the Isle of Man TT has been acknowledged and we have agreed to mark this is a more tangible way on a date to be agreed with Michael.
- Cloughmills Community Action Team received 2 significant awards. The first, as part of European Week for Waste Reduction and the second award from the Countryside Alliance.
- The iconic Dark Hedges was voted 5th in an internet poll of the most beautiful tree tunnels in the world.
- Ballymoney Model Controlled Integrated, Kilmoyle and Garryduff Primary Schools obtained a Green Flag and joined Carrowreagh, St Brigid's Ballymoney, St Patrick's Rasharkin and Ballymoney Nursery who all now fly Green Flags, the highest recognition awarded through the Eco Schools programme. Other schools are involved at different levels of the programme and a number of other schools and playgroups have availed of presentations relating to waste and our environment. Schools continue to visit Crosstagherty to look at the scale of waste management and refuse collection vehicles have visited schools and playgroups as part of our outreach activities. Presentations are also delivered within the youth sector and special interest groups.

- Building on the pioneering work instigated by Cloughmills Community Action Team, Council recently approved a policy making Ballymoney the first Incredible Edible Council in the UK. This policy has the potential to establish Ballymoney as a centre of best practice and an example of what can be achieved through partnerships with a broad spectrum of community interest groups. Others now look at what is happening in Ballymoney with almost 400 people visiting Cloughmills in the last 12 months to learn from our progress.
- Ballymaconnelly Renewal Group is the latest group to add to this momentum with the impressive 'Lint Dam Allotment Project'. Together with Incredible Edible Cloughmills, and with support from Council, the group secured £10,000 funding from the Public Health Agency. Cloughmills with £10,000 from the Public Health Agency will be participating in an exciting all island food poverty project funded by Safefood and managed by Healthy Food for All. This puts Cloughmills at the forefront of food policy development. Increasingly health professionals look to Ballymoney as an area where positive impacts are evident.
- The annual European Week for Waste Reduction programme of activities is funded by Rethink Waste in Northern Ireland and operates across Europe. It is open to businesses, Councils, charities and community groups, schools and other facilities. There were 543 different actions registered in Northern Ireland which accounted for 60% of the UK total. For the second year in a row, Cloughmills Community Action Team collected one of these prestigious awards, this year it was in the 'Judge's Favourite' category.
- We joined with officials from Glebe Rangers and Ballymoney United Football Clubs at a local derby game to celebrate the designation of Riada Playing Fields as a Queen Elizabeth II Field in Trust. I am delighted that the Riada Playing Fields have been so suitably recognized in what was a remarkable Jubilee Year.

International Links

Reaching out under our international links programme we had visits from Isle of Man, Vanves, South Africa and Isle of Skye.

A Boxing Team from Douglas IOM participated in successful Boxing Tournament held in the Leisure Centre accompanied by the Mayor and Deputy Mayor of Douglas.

We hosted Students from St Exupery High School in Vanves.

A delegation from Potchefstroom, South Africa, including the Mayor of Tlokwe, joined in the KK McArthur centenary celebrations in the build up to their marathon on Saturday 21 July.

A delegation from the Clan Donald Centre in Isle of Skye joined us on the occasion of the opening of the new Heritage Centre at Sheans Horse Farm and we had a business meeting to explore developing the Clan Donald links between our two areas.

Rate setting.

The economic downturn experienced in recent years continues to affect both domestic and business ratepayers. In February 2012, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) measure of inflation was 2.7%. However, Council delivered a zero increase in rates which continues to keep pressure on service delivery with reduced resources in real terms.

Corporate Plan

A corporate plan to 2015 has been developed following review and consultation with elected members, staff and key stakeholder groups from the private and community sector to ensure it reflects local priorities, needs and aspirations for the future of the area.

The plan is the last and most important plan for the current Council prior to the introduction of the new Council in 2015. It sets out a new vision for the borough, the new strategic priorities and key actions that the Council will deliver on before 2015.

New Initiatives & Successes

A number of projects were completed during the year.

- Drumaheglis Phase 1 provides enhanced feature entrance, improved access road, interpretation panels and tourist point and a multipurpose building for Marina.
- The next phase of work at Drumaheglis is due to start in September 2013 and will provide camping pods, and an Outdoor Activity Centre.
- Cloughmills Bio Park
- Resurfacing Cemetery Lane and Knock Road Civic Amenity Site.
- Significant upgrading to boundary fencing throughout the Borough enhancing the protection and security of Council property.
- Bus shelter at Pharis/Drones Road bus stop.

Work is now underway on further projects including

- A £1 million scheme, assisted by the EU Rural Development Programme, for new community facilities at Dervock will include a new community centre, plus adjacent new changing facilities and pitches to IFA Intermediate League standard at Dervock Recreation Grounds.
- An adventure play area at Drumbolcan Park, Rasharkin

- Enhanced lighting at Riverside Park from Raceview to the new railway footbridge.
- Roads Minister Danny Kennedy MLA officially opened Ballymoney Train Station's new walking and cycling railway bridge in November 2012 marking the completion of the local Greenway Network. The £1.3m investment delivers a series of benefits with improved access between the North and South of the town and extended park and ride facilities at the station. Roads Service has recently upgraded the footway to a shared use cycle/footway from Armour Avenue to Seymour Street at a cost of £37,000.

Funding has been levered from EU Rural Development Programme, EU Interreg Programme, Tourist Board, EU Peace III initiative to support schemes and we have also partnered with Groundwork NI.

Making a Difference

Some new programmes were introduced, while we continued to build on success of existing programmes supporting communities

- Participation in the Affordable Warmth insulation project facilitated a total of 27 households in wards with a high level of fuel poverty within the borough to apply for grant funding for insulation measures. These applicants fell outside the scope of the Warm Homes scheme and would otherwise not have qualified for grant aid. Supporting the project the Building Control service carried out a technical survey, completing a Schedule of Work, providing advice on sourcing an installer to carry out the insulation work and help with completing a Building Control application, for each of the householders who had expressed an interest in the scheme. £1620 of funding was secured from DSD towards Building Control costs involved.
- In an ongoing effort to increase awareness of and participation in waste management at home, stickers outlining materials acceptable in blue bins were placed on all black bins in the Borough. This was part of an approach to encourage householders to divert materials from black bins. Additional advertising panels for refuse collection vehicles were purchased to promote a reduction in contamination in blue bins and increase in the amount of glass recycled.
- The Borough Services Directorate continue to deliver initiatives with the support of the Public Health Agency addressing issues such as home safety affecting those under 5 and over 65 years old. The Directorate received additional funding as assistance to deal with referrals arising from DARD MARA Project (Maximising Access to and Uptake of Grants, Benefits and Services in Rural Areas).

Fuel Poverty continues to be an issue of major concern with the Directorate hosting a fuel poverty co-ordinator on behalf of 10 councils in the Northern group area.

The co-ordinator oversees work on energy efficiency and the fuel stamp saving scheme which had a turnover of £188,000. The DSD pilot affordable warmth project which included input from Environmental Health and Building Control officers resulted in an estimated investment into the borough of £86,000 in energy efficiency measures.

The funding of the co-ordinator post has been confirmed by the public health agency up to 31 March 2013 with the remit being extended to include food poverty for the first time.

In partnership with Dogs Trust, three dog microchipping roadshows were organized. This initiative continues to be very well received and affords dog owners the opportunity to get advice on various matters concerning their pets. The local Biodiversity Action Plan for the Causeway Coast and Glens Council cluster launched in February 2013. This highlights the key habitats and species that can be found locally, why they are important and what we can do to conserve or enhance them. Work to enhance and promote biodiversity is being progressed through projects at Cloughmills BioPark and Drumaheglis Marina & Caravan Park.

New Policing & Community Partnership

- Ballymoney Policing and Community Safety Partnership (PCSP) was established in April 2012 as a new statutory body bringing together in one partnership the functions and responsibilities of the former District Policing Partnerships (DPPs) and Community Safety Partnerships (CSPs). Ballymoney PCSP is facilitated by Council and overseen regionally by a joint committee with representatives from the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Northern Ireland Policing Board (NIPB).
- During the year Ballymoney PCSP funded 13 projects improving community safety and improving community confidence in policing. It is pleasing to note that projects funded and delivered by the partnership continue to be recognised locally and nationally as examples of best practice.
- An additional £35,000.00 was secured from the Criminal Confiscation Receipts Fund to purchase a car crash simulator to be used across the Causeway Coast and Glens Cluster area to promote road safety and reduce anti-social driving.

Two major Town Development Initiatives are moving forward.

- Proposals developed by the Ballymoney Regeneration Company to restore and regenerate buildings within the Conservation Area of Ballymoney were approved by the Heritage Lottery Fund, securing £1.29 million of Townscape Heritage Initiative (THI) grant. A Project Manager has been appointed and Ballymoney THI will be officially launched this month. The THI will focus on regenerating three key commercial areas of the town. Priority will be given to bringing back into sustainable use redundant or underused historic buildings to preserve the built heritage and breathe new life into the area. The scheme will run for five years.
- The draft Town Masterplan proposals have now been completed and were unveiled earlier today by the Social Development Minister Nelson McCausland. A public consultation period of 12 weeks will now commence. The final plan will provide a vision for a restored Ballymoney, with guidance on the location and form of development of our town over the next twenty years, setting out the practical steps that need to be taken to turn it into a reality.
- Work is well underway on the “virtual street” project aimed at transforming derelict properties and gap sites in the town’s Linenhall Street/Charles Street area. Funding to support the project was awarded to Council by the Department of Social Development.

Landscape Partnership Scheme

We are supporting The Heart of the Glens Landscape Partnership Scheme Stage II application which has been submitted to the Heritage Lottery Fund. The application will now be assessed and we look forward to hearing of a successful outcome before the end of September. Meantime the Trust will continue to build momentum and prepare for the implementation phase.

We welcome to the Hedges Trust project moving forward.

Events

A number of key events during the year included:

- Countryside Walks programme including biodiversity themes, Slieveanorra Ramble organised for “Get Outdoors”.
- Ballymoney Bike Week Programme 2013
- Over 20 delegates from USA, Canada, Australia, UK and Ireland attended the Route Back Home Conference in September 2012 in the Town Hall, facilitated by the Museum. The event highlighted the growing bonds with families across the world who have links with ‘the Route’ and was praised by family historians and archivists as ‘breakthrough event in the future of Ulster genealogical tourism.

- Thousands of visitors enjoyed the events in Ballymoney and Dervock, supported by Heritage Lottery, which attracted media attention and on-line coverage seen by people across the world.
Community involvement and civic pride was obvious to everyone who was fortunate enough to take part and strengthened the relationship between McArthur's adopted home in Potchefstroom.
- KK McArthur was inducted into Ballymoney Sports Advisory Committee Hall of Fame 2012.
- Activity delivered by the Sports Development Unit attracting 450 participants included: Riada Road Race, Summer Sports Camps for football, hockey, volleyball, netball, Multisports League, Fit for Life Programme involving schools, supporting the growth of Junior clubs for Ladies Football, Netball and Volleyball.
The Leisure Centre's Active Communities Programme delivered a range of programmes which attracted 1000 participants. These included:
 - Active age club physical activity programmes in Loughgiel, Rasharkin, Cloughmills, Carnany, Glebeside, Disability Programmes in Special Unit Class in St Brigid's school in Ballymoney and local Nursing Homes.
 - Activity programme for MENCAP and WAVE groups.
 - Nursery school programme in Model Nursery, Rasharkin and Dunloy
 - Multisports coaching in primary and secondary schools and community groups.
 - Coaching support for Hockey, Football and Table Tennis.
 - Indoor and Outdoor Athletics Competitions in 2 High Schools to celebrate the Olympic year.
 - Introduction, in partnership with Ballymoney Community Safety Partnership, of Cage Sport in communities, with a team represented Ballymoney in the first Cage Football Final at Benone Beach.
 - Summer Programme in community centres and Leisure centre.

Significant issues which engaged members' attention during the year included:

- We continue to press the case for the implementation of the scheme to upgrade the A26 to dual carriageway.
- We considered and commented upon the consultation on Transforming Your Care and endorsed a response prepared by NILGA on behalf of local government.
- We supported The Friends of the Roddens opposition to proposals to redefine the status of the Roddens Residential Home and endorsed their case for the Roddens to remain in its present and dedicated role, as a residential home primarily for the benefit of the long-term care of the elderly citizens of the town and borough of Ballymoney.
- We rejected the welfare cuts agenda and austerity policies being pursued at Westminster which are targeted at the most vulnerable and

disadvantaged in our society and which will create significant hardship and difficulties for many individuals and families and called on the Assembly to amend the Welfare Reform Bill.

- We lent our support to the Declaration on Age Friendly Cities and Communities in Europe and I signed the declaration on Council's behalf
- We engaged with Roads Service, Water Service and Housing Executive with regard to their work programmes in the borough and commented on a range of consultation documents.

Local Government Reform

No-one should be in any doubt that the reform of local government, reducing 26 councils to 11 in 2015, is on course. The announcement of Executive funding of £48 million for transition; the publication this week of Regulations for the Statutory Transition Committees to be established by early August 2013, to prepare the way for the shadow councils to be elected in 2014; the direction to the STCs that they appoint clerks to the new councils; along with the agreement by the Executive on powers and functions to transfer from central government departments, all indicate in the clearest possible terms that this time there will be no turning back. With fewer than 650 days to go, there is much to be done!

Thanks

I thank my fellow Members, my Chaplain, Rev. McNie, the Chief Executive, Officers and all staff for their support and their service.

I also thank the local press, journalists and photographers, who attend our meetings and events and play a vital role in communicating to our citizens and to the wider community covered by their publications."

He thanked party leader Alderman Kennedy, Alderman Campbell and members for their confidence in nominating him to the role. Councillor Finlay said it was a great honour and he hoped to see continued progress in the coming year on Council's plans. The town and borough were facing difficult economic

conditions and he welcomed the launch of the Masterplan and the work being undertaken to improve Linenhall Street and commended the Committee for its work in ensuring the borough moves forward.

It was proposed by Alderman Kennedy, seconded by Alderman Campbell and **AGREED:**
