411.1 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no Declarations of Interest.

411.2 CEMETERY ACCESSIBILITY

Councillor Finlay raised the issue of vehicular access within the bounds of the town cemetery. He was concerned that with the control bollards having been re-instated to prevent damage which had occurred to headstones and surrounds that some people who were less mobile were now restricted as regards their visiting to their loved ones graves. He asked that a better solution be investigated and implemented. The Director of Borough Services gave some background information and advised that he would have the matter addressed in order to report back to Committee as soon as possible.

He advised that his main purpose on this visit was to erect a play park for the children of Msongwe using up-cycled play equipment kindly donated by Council. He thanked members for the donation and advised that any other equipment which might be made available would also make a real difference to the people of Malawi. Members praised Mr Campbell for putting the play equipment to good use for others to appreciate.

The Director of Borough Services indicated that similar equipment would be available given the Council's present upgrade projects and suggested that this be donated as previously.

to recommend that Council donate to the Malawi Project any further surplus play equipment identified.

411.7 COMMUNITY BUILDINGS UPGRADE PROJECT

Since authority was granted by Council (Minute LAC402.16.2 refers), work has been undertaken to prepare and cost a schedule of work to improve and maintain the fabric and facilities at Killyrammer and Rasharkin Community Centres and at the Social Centre, Ballymoney. The detailed reports for each 'community' building were circulated. The findings may be summarised thus:-

Priority 1 serious/unavoidable – typically relating to health and safety compliance; items requiring immediate attention to avoid a major breakdown, serious hazard or critical deterioration leading to possible closure of building;

Priority 2 poor/essential – typically works that if neglected might lead to damage to the value of the property and premature replacement;

Priority 3 fair/necessary – where neglect might affect rental income, the condition of the element is less than adequate and defects need to be remedied within two/three years;

Priority 4 adequate/desirable – works necessary to maintain an element in repair but probably not in the immediate short term. Might include elements that would improve working conditions or generate financial benefits as energy conservation.

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Committee consider the findings and make a recommendation to Council.

In response to a query from Alderman Kennedy the Director affirmed that the report findings were cost estimates.

It was proposed by Alderman Kennedy, seconded by Councillor Robinson and **AGREED:**

to recommend that Council progress Schemes to improve and maintain the fabric and facilities at Killyrammer Community Centre, Rasharkin Community Centre and the Social Centre, Ballymoney by implementing Priorities 1,2,3 and 4 for each building.

Alderman Kennedy suggested that the work also be prioritised so that the building most in need of refurbishment [such as the Social Centre] was dealt with first.

411.9 PLAY AREA ETC. AT DRUMAHEGLIS MARINA & CARAVAN PARK

In accordance with the Council's budget provision work is on-going as regards the necessary upgrade to the play area at Drumaheglis together with the provision of outdoor gym equipment. Presently the proposed timeline to project commencement is - tenders to issue week ending 29th November with the contractor appointed to be on site before the end of January 2014, the contract duration being 6 weeks.

411.10 BUS SHELTERS

This report, circulated, has previously been in front of Committee/Council for consideration and decision. The report primarily relates to the oldest reinforced concrete panel (RCP) type bus shelters dating back to the 1970's, of which 27 no. remain.

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Council adopt the recommendations contained in the report.

Councillor Stevenson, Councillor McAfee and Councillor Robinson drew attention to requests received for new bus shelters at Kilraughts Road, Glebeside and Frocess Road respectively. Alderman Connolly made reference to the need for an additional bus shelter at Drones Road and in respect of Magherahoney where the shelter had been removed.

The Director of Borough Services took members through the recommendations contained in the report and answered member questions.

It was proposed by Councillor Stevenson, seconded by Councillor McAfee and **AGREED:**

to recommend that Council adopt the following report recommendations, namely –

- ***Remove the four shelters listed;***
- ***Replace the seven shelters detailed; and***
- ***Repaint and repair the remaining fifteen RCP shelters.***

411.11 PLAY AREAS

This report, circulated, has previously been in front of Committee/Council for consideration and decision.

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Committee advise Council as to the policy it ought to implement in respect of its aging network of play areas in need of upgrade or removal.

The Director answered a number of member queries. After discussion, Councillor Robinson considered a rationale was required to be applied along with guidance on how to decide the need for a play area, bearing in mind the requirement for upkeep costs and actual usage.

It was proposed by Councillor Stevenson, seconded by Councillor Halliday and **AGREED:**

LEISURE SERVICES**411.16 JOEY DUNLOP LEISURE CENTRE - TEMPORARY CHANGING FACILITIES FOR HOCKEY TEAMS**

The Director of Central and Leisure Services gave details of estimated costs for 3 Options for the refurbishment/replacement of the existing temporary changing facilities. The estimated costs ranged from £56k to £100k which included a provisional amount to provide a new power supply as the council's consultants, Cogan and Shackleton felt that the existing supply may not have the capacity to feed the building.

The Director advised that some initial work has been carried out regarding the proposed sports hall extension to the leisure centre. She suggested that further consideration be given to this project before a decision was made regarding the temporary changing facilities. She advised that the sports hall project would be included in the 2014/15 Capital Programme to be considered by members at the Rates Estimates Workshop on 27th November. Councillor Robinson requested that drawings be available at the workshop. The Director advised that all avenues for grant aid would be explored.

It was proposed by Councillor Stevenson, seconded by Alderman Connolly and **AGREED:**

to recommend that Council consider the provision of a sports hall extension to the Joey Dunlop Leisure Centre as part of the 2014/15 Capital Programme, in the interim, no action be taken on the temporary changing rooms.

411.17 COMMUNITY SERVICES GRANT 2013/14

The Department for Social Development (DSD) has advised that the Voluntary & Community Unit (VCU) has secured an additional £1.5 million for the Community Support Programme in 2013/14, to be allocated on the same basis as the original 2013/14 award. The funding must be spent by the 31st March 2014 and the Council is not required to match the additional funding.

The additional funding for Community Support General amounts to £12,720.00

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Council accepts the additional funding of £12,720.00 and use it for the following purposes:

£3,720 – Capacity Training for Community Groups;
£4,000 – Event management Training for Community groups;
£4,000 – Causeway Coast and Glens combined Community Support Strategy and Common Grant Policy;

This is less than the 2013/14 budget submitted to OFMDFM for funding.

The Director advised that a request was made to OFMDFM for additional funding to enable the Council to deliver its action plan for the year. A revised Letter of Offer was received, offering an additional £9,000 bring the total funding to £82,846.61

Councillor Stevenson commended the Officer for seeking additional funding.

Appendix A: Borough Bus Shelters

Condition Report on Existing Reinforced Concrete Panel Bus Shelters 2013

Following recent information from Translink/Ulsterbus confirming that a number of the existing reinforced concrete panel (RCP) bus shelters are no longer in use, together with reports on the poor state of a number of RCP shelters, a condition report was requested.

Findings:

There are currently 50 bus shelters located within Ballymoney Borough of which 26 (plus Magherahoney removed) are the oldest RCP shelters dating back to the 1970's, see attached location map. The table below summarises their current condition and proposed actions for improvement. Those shelters requiring immediate action are highlighted in red.

RCP Shelter 1: Stranocum (Fivey Road)



Plate 1: RCP Shelter at Stranocum (Fivey Rd) in poor condition and subject to repeated anti social behavior including graffiti, litter and drinking.

The area to the rear of the shelter is also abused. A replacement Perspex shelter would make the use of the shelter more visual to the public

RCP Shelter 4: Magherahoney (Coolkeeran Rd) (now removed)



Plate 4: RCP Shelter at Magherahoney flagged up by the PSNI as dangerous in location and subject to repeated anti social behavior problems. The shelter is in a very poor physical condition. PSNI recommendation to remove immediately.

RCP Shelter 5: Ben Vista (Loughguile)



Plate 7: RCP Shelter at Ben Vista in very poor condition and subject to repeated abuse. Replacement with a Perspex shelter would make the use more visual.

Plates 8 & 9 below highlight the poor condition.



RCP Shelter 12: Garryduff Cross (Garryduff Rd)



Plate 10: RCP Shelter at Garryduff Cross in a poor condition with rusting/decaying metal frame and holes in the roof.

Plates 11 & 12 below highlight the poor condition.



RCP Shelter 14: Dunloy (Garryduff Rd)



Plate 13: RCP Shelter at Dunloy in a poor condition and subject to anti-social behavior. The metal frame is in adequate condition but there is significant plaster panel damage. It would be a better solution to replace the shelter with a Perspex one making the use more visual than repeatedly trying to fix it.

Plates 14 & 15 below highlight the poor condition.



RCP Shelter 16: Heatherton Cross (Bellaghy)



Plate 16: RCP Shelter at Heatherton Cross is another which could be considered for replacement with a Perspex shelter due to its deteriorating condition with holes in the roof, the floor breaking up and general disrepair.

Plates 17 & 18 below highlight the deterioration.



RCP Shelter 17: Craigs (Drumcon – Rasharkin)



Plate 19: RCP Shelter at Craigs is in a poor condition largely due to the fact that the floor lies below the path level and is subject to repeated flooding making it practically unusable. Replacement with a Perspex shelter would allow for the surface water to drain away due to its open base.

RCP Shelter 20: Greymount Park (Finvoy Rd)

Plates 20 & 21 below highlight the RCP Shelter at Greymount Park which is in a poor condition due to regular anti social behavior resulting in broken glass, graffiti and being used as a public convenience making it not fit for purpose. It too should be considered for replacement with a Perspex shelter to make more visual to the public.



“Adequate Shelters”

Some 15 of the 26 RCP shelters have been deemed “adequate for use.” These are largely unaffected by anti social behavior problems and their condition is such that the metal frames remain intact and are generally not hazardous for public use. All however require minor running repairs from time to time and in all cases there is a need for repainting to be carried out. Plates 22 to 25 below highlight a selection of these RCP examples.

Recommendations:

1. Remove the four shelters below as they are no longer in use by Translink, Logan's or NEELB:

- Lavin (Drones Rd)
- Five Road Ends (Frosses Rd)
- Mullan Rd (Tullaghans Rd)
- Seacon Cross (Newbridge Rd)

2. Consider replacing 7 existing shelters with Perspex ones giving top priority to;

1. Ben Vista (Loughguile) due to its hazardous state for public use
2. Stranocum (Fivey Rd) due to the level of antisocial behavior
3. Dunloy (Garryduff Rd) due to the level of antisocial behaviour and disrepair
4. Greymount Park (Finvoy Rd) due to the level of anti social behavior

3. Consider repainting and carrying out minor repairs to the remaining 15 RCP shelters deemed "adequate for use."

4. Consider removal or replacement of brick built shelter at Main Street, Cloughmills due to the level of antisocial behaviour.
