LEISURE SERVICES**416.3 COMMUNITY FESTIVAL FUND**

AMENITIES

416.8 CEMETERY ACCESS

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Council note that the new access arrangements to the cemetery for less able bodied are now in place. The existing lunchtime arrangements will cease on 30th April 2014.

The Head of Amenities responded to members questions. It was the member view that no deposit ought to be levied against the supply of a fob and that any money taken be refunded. As previously it was noted that the cemetery was not designed to accommodate vehicles generally and that unrestricted vehicular movement within the cemetery had caused significant damage to grassed areas, headstones and grave surrounds.

It was proposed by Councillor Finlay, seconded by Councillor McAfee and **AGREED:**

to recommend that:

1. *no deposit be taken for issuing a fob, but any replacement would be at a cost of £10 and that any monies taken to date be refunded and;*
2. *a site meeting for members be arranged to view the cemetery.*

416.9 ELECTRICITY CONTRACT

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Council notes that for 2014/15 electricity will be supplied by Airtricity and LCC Ltd. This contract award follows the funding process carried out on behalf of a consortium of local Councils. Half hourly metered sites will show savings of 0.7% on 2013/14.

416.10 DRUMAHEGLIS MARINA & CARAVAN PARK

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Council notes that Drumaheglis Marina and Caravan Park has retained its 5* status for 2014 under the prestigious AA Scheme.

Alderman Kennedy welcomed the retention of this status and congratulated the facility on its achievement. Alderman Campbell concurred with his remarks.

416.11 FESTIVE LIGHTING

Following the well-received upgrade of the Festive Lights, in 2013 it was proposed as part of the Rates Estimate for 2014-15 that a budget of £30,000 be set aside to further enhance and extend the lighting scheme to include:

- more features on Victoria Street
- introduction of additional lights to the trees on Meetinghouse Street
- additional "Welcome to Ballymoney" features
- introduction of a light ceiling to Linenhall Street

- additional miscellaneous features.

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Committee considers this matter and makes a recommendation to Council.

At the request of Councillor Robinson, the Head of Amenities advised that a decision would need to be made no later than end of July/beginning of August to ensure that any additional lighting would be in place in time for Christmas

A discussion took place regarding what ought to be done to possibly enhance the town lighting Scheme

It was proposed by Councillor Robinson, seconded by Councillor McAfee and **AGREED:**

to recommend that the matter be deferred until after rationalisation of Council's reserve account in June.

416.12 AMENITIES PROJECTS UPDATE

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Council notes the completion of the following projects:

- Dervock Riverside Park MUGA and adventure play area.
- Drumbolcan Park, Rasharkin, extension to car park, walkway and outdoor gym equipment.
- Replacement pontoon at Drumaheglis Marina & Caravan Park.
- Refurbished play area at Drumaheglis Marina & Caravan Park.
- Dervock Community Facilities Project.

Update on the following projects:

- Drumaheglis Tourism Development Project – should be completed in time for May Bank Holiday.
- Glebeside Outdoor Recreational Facilities Project – lease with NIHE has been agreed.
- Megaw Park, Ballymoney Improvement Scheme – progressing with no issues.
- Bus Shelter at Main Street, Cloughmills – has been replaced with modern polycarbonate shelter.

Councillor Stevenson commended officers for the work being carried out and stated that re-opening of the park in late summer would coincide with the 75th anniversary of the opening of Megaw Park in September 1939.

At the request of Councillor McLean, the Head of Amenities clarified Council procedures in respect of work it would tender.

It was proposed by Councillor Stevenson, seconded by Councillor McAfee and **AGREED:**

to recommend that Council notes the update given in respect of the amenities mentioned.

416.13 LAND ACQUISITION - CORKEY ROAD CYCLE/FOOTPATH SCHEME

DRD Roads Service has approached Ballymoney Borough Council regarding land acquisition for a proposed cycle/footway along the northern boundary of Corkey Road. The proposed 2 metre wide path will run from Rockend, Corkey some 1.5 miles to the petrol filling station at Ben Vista, Corkey. As part of the scheme DRD Roads Service wish to acquire some 0.0463 hectares of land along the roadside frontage at Rockend playground from Ballymoney Borough Council. Location and site maps together with photographs were circulated.

DRD Roads Service have requested that Ballymoney Borough Council consider transferring this small parcel of land to them at the nominal sum of £1, to facilitate this valuable community orientated scheme. The land is required in order to divert the proposed path behind existing trees which are a landmark in this area. As the area of land in question is not used as an integral part of the play area itself, it is recommended that members consider this request favourably on certain conditions given the community benefits for health and wellbeing and in terms of road safety for both pedestrians and cyclists living locally.

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Committee considers this request from DRD Roads Service and make recommendation to Council.

The Head of Service responded to questions from members relating to the responsibility for maintaining the footpath, the land between the footpath and roadside and the maintenance of the trees at the location. He suggested that DRD should be asked to provide a fence line, take full responsibility for maintenance from the fence line to the roadside which includes the trees, and cover all legal expenses. Councillor Stevenson referred to land at Riverside Park.

It was proposed by Councillor Stevenson, seconded by Councillor McKeown and **AGREED:**

to recommend that an approach is made to DRD to ascertain their view on providing a boundary fence, taking responsibility for maintenance including maintenance of the trees and paying all legal expenses.

416.14 USE OF RIVERSIDE PARK, BALLYMONEY

416.15 EXTENSION TO PUBLIC TOILET OPENING HOURS

A request has been received from North Antrim Bands Forum requesting that the Public Toilets opening times be extended until 10.30pm to cater for band parades taking place in Ballymoney on 11th, 21st June, 23rd, 26th July and 16th August 2014. The Public Toilets normal opening hours are from 9am to 6pm.

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Committee considers this request and makes recommendation to Council.

It was proposed by Councillor Stevenson, seconded by Councillor McAfee and **AGREED:**

to recommend that the opening times for public toilets be extended until 10.30pm to cater for band parades taking place in Ballymoney on 11th, 21st June, 23rd, 26th July and 16th August 2014.

At the request of Councillor Stevenson, the Head of Services agreed to obtain further details and costings for the use of a Radar system.

416.16 CHILDREN’S HEARTBEAT TRUST (CHD)

A request has been received from a local charity, the Children’s Heartbeat Trust. In May this year, as part of the campaign to raise awareness of congenital heart defects and the impact they can have, the 23rd May 2014 will be *Heart on your Sleeve Day*. As part of this CHD hope to place specially designed hearts on the sleeves of some of the most iconic statues that stand in towns, villages and cities

across Northern Ireland, highlighting the fact that congenital heart defects affect children right across the country.

CHD would hope to use the Joey Dunlop statue in Ballymoney as part of its campaign and has sought the Council's permission for this.

During the ensuing discussion reference was made to the adjoining statue of Robert Dunlop.

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Council approves this request

- 1. that Council write to the organisers seeking advice as to whether they wish to place a heart on the sleeve of both statues and;*
- 2. write to both families according to the response from Children's Heartbeat Trust.*

416.17 BIKE WEEK 2014

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Council note that Ballymoney's pink "Giro" themed 2014 Bike Week Programme of events will run from 14th – 22nd June.

Over and above the Giro race itself, there are 6 public events starting on Thursday 8th May with "Cycle Safely the Giro Way" in association with Ballymoney Roads Safety Committee and concluding on Saturday 21st June with the ever popular 18 mile long Lower Bann Leisure Cycle. These events are made possible with the valuable assistance of both Ballymoney Cycling Club and the PSNI. This year, more events have been organised in association with Coleraine Borough Council and the Coleraine Bann Wheelers Cycling Club to make the programme bigger and better than ever. Behind the scenes there has been increased effort to work with schools resulting in 4 cycle training sessions arranged with Landhead, Leaney, the Model Integrated and St. Brigid's Primary Schools during May, culminating in a Cycle to School Day on Friday 20th June with over 70 children expected to participate. Organised in association with Ballymoney Road Safety Committee, there will be a Bike Breakfast for the children in Riverside Park before cycling to their respective schools. All of the events are possible due to the continued support of Travelwise NI with 50% match funding towards the programme. A copy of the Bike Week 2014 events can be found in the Appendix to this report.

Councillor McKeown congratulated the officer, Sonya Crawford, for her Bike Week Programme organized in conjunction with Ballymoney Road Safety Committee.

416.18 BALLYMONEY COUNTRYSIDE EVENTS PROGRAMME 2014

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Council note that annual Countryside Walks Programme which this year is entitled "Events" due to the range of activities on offer. There are 9 events in total beginning on Wednesday 21st May with a taster session in Nordic Walking and concluding on Saturday 20th September with the Croaghan Way Half-Day Ramble as part of national "Get Outdoors" Weekend. The previously successful format of 5 countryside rambles and 4 biodiversity events has been continued and this year features bogs, fishing and bats with 7 of the events including refreshments. There is a nominal charge for 4 of the events, 4 are subject to booking, and 5 are totally free of charge. Causeway Coast & Glens Heritage Trust have included both the fishing and bat events in their annual events programme. Fishing is a new event for 2014 and DCAL have been generous in their commitment of both staff, angling equipment and free fishing licences for the "Go Fishing" event at Altnahinch Dam on Saturday 23rd August. The Bank of Ireland continues to support the programme by way of sponsorship and yet again many private landowners welcome the public onto their land to participate in these popular events. 416.19 "BOGS OF BALLYMONEY" PROJECT

IT IS RECOMMENDED that Council notes the "Bogs of Ballymoney" booklet, part of the Bogs of Ballymoney project which includes new footpath, interpretation and infrastructure works on the Croaghan Way. This special area lies within Slieveanorra and Croaghan Area of Special Scientific Interest (ASSI) and is one of the few accessible designated bog land areas in Northern Ireland thanks to a Public Path Agreement with landowners Blakiston Houston Estates. The booklet includes information on all of Ballymoney's special bog land areas including Garry Bog and Dunloy and Caldanagh Bogs, part of the Main Valley Bogs Special Area for Conservation (SAC). The project was made possible through partnership working between Causeway Coast & Glens Heritage Trust, the Northern Ireland Environment Agency and Ballymoney's Biodiversity and Countryside Access Officers. The project was fully funded through the 2014 NGO Challenge Fund.

A copy of the “Bogs of Ballymoney” will be available at the Committee Meeting.

416.21 ADDITIONAL PLAY PARK AREAS

Councillor McKeown referred to the additional Christmas lighting scheme which has been recommended for consideration after rationalisation of Council's accounts in June expressing the view that the budget for the refurbishment of play areas should also be reconsidered at that time, the current budget for play park work being £175,000.

It was proposed by Councillor McKeown, seconded by Councillor McAfee and
AGREED:

*to recommend that play park area refurbishment be put on
Committee's agenda in June with a view to extending the budget for
additional areas.*

The meeting closed at 7.50 pm.
