MINUTES:

The minutes of meeting dated 21 April 2009 were approved and signed on the proposal of Councillor Coyle, seconded by Councillor Ó hOisín.

MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETINGS:

• Repair of Roadway at Pattersons Chip Shop: Roads Service confirmed that this section of the road has now been repaired.

SCHEDULE OF PLANNING APPLICATIONS: (Deferred applications – see appendix):

Mr Donaghy answered queries on applications listed on the deferred schedule and the recommendations were accepted subject to the following:

ROAD SERVICE – SPRING CONSULTATION REPORT:

The Chair welcomed Ms Deidre Mackle, Network Maintenance Manager and Mr Keith Cradden, Section Engineer Roads Service to the meeting.

Ms Mackle presented the Northern Division Roads Service Report which detailed work completed in 2008/2009 and proposed schemes to be undertaken in 2009/2010 including resurfacing of roads and pathways, surface dressing, drainage, carriageway strengthening, minor work schemes, traffic schemes, traffic management, maintenance of structures, street lighting and strategic road improvements.

The following queries/concerns were highlighted by members in the discussion which followed:

- Members welcomed the announcement regarding the preferred route for the by-pass at Dungiven and to the fact that funding had been secured to purchase land to provide a Park & Share car park.
- Gortnaghey & Altgarren Roads to be included in the winter gritting scheme.
- The edge of Birrin Road was in need of repair.
- A pathway was needed for walkers at Roe Valley Country Park.
- It was suggested that Traffic Wardens were needed in Dungiven to enforce law in relation to double parking, misuse of disability spaces and parking on footpaths.
- The road realignment at Ardgarven was welcomed.
- Traffic Calming measures at rural schools was welcomed.
- It was stated that vehicle users were frustrated at the amount of road works in the Borough and it was suggested that additional signs were needed to advise drivers of alternative routes.
- Request that Roads Service consult with businesses in Ballykelly regarding the proposed roads works in the area.
- Upgrade lighting at Protestant and William Street.
- It was pointed out that farmland would be decimated if Ballykelly by-pass did not go through Shackleton Army Camp.
- It was reinforced that a footpath was needed from Ballykelly to St Finloughs church.
- Disappointment was expressed that the Gortcorbies scheme had been delayed due to environmental problems.
- Suggested that stronger weed killer should be used to clear footpaths.
- Bus shelter needed at Termoncanice Primary School.

The Chair thanked representatives from Roads Service for attending the meeting.

Housing Council's Housing Policy Convention: The Chief Executive outlined that letter had been received from Northern Ireland Housing Council seeking nominations to the Housing Policy Convention and to request a contribution of £200 from each Council. The request was declined.
